1 Overriding Activity Parameter at Run Time

This section explains how to override the parameter of any activity at run time. For example message field of Mail Notification activity.

Steps to override "Message" field of Mail Notification activity using putcontext-var

- 1. Click tree structure in the Repository View panel. Expand the Action list and select the put-context-var action and drag it to the Graph Canvas area before the Mail Notification activity whose "To" field is to be overridden.




Figure 1.1: Connect put-context-var to Mail Notification

- 2. Connect the put-context-var action to the Mail Notification (see Figure 1.1).




Figure 1.2: Properties of Put-context-var

3. Right-click put-context-var and select View Properties. Its properties are displayed in the Properties Panel in the Bottom Pane (Figure 1.2).




Figure 1.3: Edit Context Variable

4. Click Edit button to edit the value of context variable. The (Figure 1.3) dialog box is displayed.

- 5. Click Add Variable () to add new context variable. The <u>Context Variable Information</u> screen is displayed.
- 6. Select the activity, whose parameter is to be overridden (for example, EvalRec_MailNotification) from Activity Name drop-down list. All variables of this task are listed in the Variable Name drop-down list.
- 7. Select message from Variable Name drop-down list.
- 8. Enter the \$\$ProcessFlowVariableName\$\$ doing this will extract the value stored in process flow variable and will be sent to you in message field of the Mail Notification Activity.




Figure 1.4: Context Variable Details for Overriding message body

The entered information is displayed as shown in Figure 1.4.

- 9. Click Done to close Context Variable Information screen. This takes the control back to the Edit Context variable screen. The newly created variable is added to the list of existing context variables.
- 10. Click Done to close Edit Context variable screen and return to Process Designer.
- 11. Save the process flow and exit from Process Designer.
